Dear Congresswoman Roybal-Allard and Congressman Joyce,

On behalf of the 57 undersigned organizations representing the Nursing Community Coalition (NCC), we would like to thank you for introducing H.R. 8812, the *Improving Care and Access to Nurses (ICAN) Act*. The NCC is a cross section of education, practice, research, and regulation within the nursing profession representing Registered Nurses (RNs), Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRNs),¹ nurse leaders, students, faculty, and researchers. Together, we support this comprehensive effort to ensure patients, including those under Medicare and Medicaid, have access to the high-quality care provided by our nation's APRNs.

As we have witnessed throughout the COVID-19 pandemic and beyond, nurses and APRNs continue to lead at the frontline of our health care system. From primary and maternal care to acute and chronic care, APRNs serve in all settings and in areas throughout the nation, including rural and underserved communities. As of 2020, over 233,000 APRNs treated Medicare patients and approximately 40% of Medicare beneficiaries received care from an APRN.²

The ICAN Act would remove outdated barriers in the Medicare and Medicaid programs that currently prevent APRNs from practicing to the full extent of their education and clinical training. Removing these barriers will also increase patients' timely access to care from the provider of their choice. Removing these barriers on APRNs and Medicare and Medicaid beneficiaries is consistent with recommendations from a broad range of organizations, including the National Academy of Medicine, the National Governors Association, the National Rural Health Association, the Federal Trade Commission, the Bipartisan Policy Center, the Brookings Institution, Americans for Prosperity, and the American Enterprise Institute.

As we continue to support the health care of our communities throughout the country, and create a more equitable system, passing the ICAN Act is essential. We appreciate your leadership in this effort as we work to address today's challenges and prepare for a healthier tomorrow.
